Malaysia is going through extraordinary times, and in these times, extraordinary measures have been taken. In line with the Director-General Health of Malaysia's statement even before the Movement Control Order (MCO) was issued, [we postponed all builds until 1 May 2020](#), and will extend the postponement if necessary. It was not an easy decision to make, but we must always prioritise the interests of the Orang Asli communities we serve, even if it goes against the promises we originally made.

We had hoped to continue the fundraising efforts for Malaysian Women Unite, but we also have to consider the nation's immediate concerns. With that, we have decided that it is only prudent to postpone the campaign to a target date of **Mothers' Day on 10 May 2020**. Any funds collected so far will be kept until the re-launch of the campaign.

In the meantime, please be assured that we are in continuous contact with all the Orang Asli communities we work with, to ensure that they stay safe and have access to any assistance that they may need. We have also decided to help ease efforts aimed at those affected by Covid-19 and the MCO on our tech platform Sedunia ([www.sedunia.me](http://www.sedunia.me)) by waiving our 3% service fee and offering quicker payouts. With this, we hope that impacted groups will have greater access to much-needed funds and resources.

We are utterly grateful for all your support and the effort you've put in thus far and we apologise for any inconvenience this postponement may cause to you. You have our guarantee that this campaign and its goals will not be forgotten. We can only hope that we will have your continued support when we resume.
