With the conditional Movement Control Order (MCO), many Malaysians and businesses are carefully planning a staggered return to society. Meanwhile, we are mindful that we are not completely out of the woods and that a small misstep could end up with severe consequences.

In our previous circular, our plan was to relaunch the campaign on **Mothers' Day on 10 May 2020**. This day is rapidly approaching. As a nation, we are allowed to return to some semblance of the way things were before, but it is our individual responsibility to ensure that we do not take this bit of freedom for granted. Hence, the sensible thing to do is not to carry on with any campaign that involves the building of homes. It is with a heavy heart, but one that is at ease, that we have decided to **hold off on the relaunch of Malaysian Women Unite in 2020**. As pledged, any funds collected so far will be reserved exclusively for this campaign. It is our hope in 2021 we may return to our original aim of uniting all Malaysian women for a nation building exercise to empower our country's very foundation - families of all shapes and sizes.

Our focus remains on the concerted efforts of all parties, governmental and non-governmental, in the aid and rehabilitation of the lives of the Orang Asli, via the Covid-19 Collective for Orang Asli (www.sedunia.me/oa-collective). We have been actively fundraising for communities in dire need of short-term relief, and we are now transitioning into a recovery phase that addresses longer-term issues.
